Look at our worm stew!






We particularly liked counting the eyeballs.






Now we are getting ready for our Christmas performance, making costumes and practising our songs. We are also making cards and decorations, so there is a lot of glitter in Reception at the moment!




IN YEAR 2 WE HAVE BEEN WORKING VERY HARD ALL TERM. WE ARE






In Maths we have been working very hard to learn our times tables and divisions. We have had some really tricky sums to work out and have been learning different ways of working them out.



TEST YOUR MATHS SKILLS ON THESE TRICKY SUMS






WELCOME TO YEAR 4


Here's what have been learning all about since September.

HEROES and VILLANS


In Topic we are learning about heroes and villains. Currently we are reading Beowulf and during Autumn 1 we read The Highwayman. Both books have people that have saved the day and people that cause trouble and problems. The Highway man is a poem that tells the story of nameless highway man who is in love with Bess, a landlord's daughter. The Highway man is betrayed by a jealous stable boy and escapes ambush when Bess sacrifices her life to save him. Learning of her death he dies himself in an attempt at revenge, shot down on the highway.



A YEAR 6 REVIEW

In year six, we have been learning about VOLCANDES!!! Every time a volcano erupts it's due to pressure inside the volcano chute. A volcano is formed when a Tectonic plate under the sea collides with a Tectonic plate under a continent.

Also in year six, we have been learning about a form of math called BODMAS or in secondary school it's BIDMAS. BODMAS or BIDMAS stands for Brackets... Over... Division... Multiplication... Addition and Subtraction, here is an example of a BODMAS question ... 72-(14+43) $x_{10}=150$... it's really, **REALLY** cool.

Our mainly focused story in English is called Wally and Ollie, in this story, a boy named Wally had been bullied, but he decides to get revenge one day. He loves to read his book called creepy crawlies, so on the way to school one day... he found a spider on a leaf. He slipped it into his pocket and at school he showed it to Ollie and he started to cry, his power was lost and the worm had turned.

IN TOPIC WORK, WE HAVE BEEN LEARNING ABOUT GOING GLOBAL. THIS TOPIC IS ABOUT THE WORLD AND FEATURES OF IT... LIKE OF THE WORLDS TECTONIC PLATES AND THE MOVEMENT OF THEM. FOR E.G. THE INDIAN PLATE WHEN IT CRASHED INTO THE EUROASIAN PLATE IT CRUMBLED AND CRACKED TO FORM THE HIMALAYA MOUNTAINS. THE INDIAN PLATE CRASHED INTO THE EUROASIAN PLATE AS FAST AS A BULLET... MATHS

In math's we love the new method for quadrilaterals. One of our methods is (n -2) x 180. We also liked area & perimeter. The method involved multiplying length & width. We are also learning how to add and subtract fractions we are about to learn how to dived and multiply fraction.

ENGLISH

TOPIC

In topic we learnt about the earths layers. The layers are called the crust, the mantle, the inner core & the outer core. We live on the crust which is the first layer and surprisingly the thinnest layer. The mantle is made of molten rock which is the next layer it moves every day. The next layer is the outer crust which is made of lava. This is so hot it can melt some- one. The final layer is the mantle and scientists believe that is made of iron.

They think this because it will stop us floating away.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

In P.E we are doing gymnastics and some games. In gymnastics we needed to do a bridge, forward roll and dive forward roll. We learnt about big patches and small patches. We played cricket and rounders' we also have been learning to cooperate with one another in different team games.


