School Lunches

As mentioned in previous correspondence children will be returning to eating in the hall from a new menu following the half term break. When children return to the hall they will access the hall as a year group, they will sit with their classmates in line with our Covid-19 risk assessment. Numbers accessing the hall at any one time will be greatly reduced, all tables/equipment cleaned thoroughly between sittings and hall areas will be well ventilated. Children will be accessing an updated menu, meaning we are able to offer more variety due to meals being served directly from the school kitchen. Please be assured that staff will support all children with this transition and all appropriate safety measures (Covid-19) have been considered and are in place. The new menu will be available to view on our school website very soon.

Also, as we are now half way through autumn term, please check you ParentPay account and bring any outstanding items up to day.

Walk Once a Week Challenge (WOW)

We are continuing with the 'WOW' school challenge for the 2021 - 2022 academic year. Children in year 1 to 6 will continue to log their daily journey to school on their class travel tracker and those that walk at least once a week earn a badge, with 10 to collect across the year.

If travelling by car please remember to park **at least 5 - 10 minutes away** from school to ensure your child has the opportunity to increase their physical activity, and earn their badge. The safety of our children is paramount and by doing this we will create a safe environment for our children coming in to school. Let's swap those school runs for school walks!

COP26 Climate Conference-SMITH Patches

Andy James (member of our local community) and his friends are taking part in the Camino to COP - a long walk to Glasgow before the COP26 Climate Conference. World Leaders will be meeting there in November to decide how they plan to tackle the climate emergency. It's really important that people let their governments know what they think they should be doing before the conference. Andy is planning on talking to lots of people on his walk to find out how climate change is affecting them already and what they think could and should be done about it.

Children from across the school sent messages and pictures, on small fabric patches, to express what they care about and to wish Andy well on his journey.

Andy has sent us a further update. He is currently close to Lockerbie and has informed us our children's patches have been sewn inside the "Coat of Hope". Once at COP the coat will be offered to delegates to wear, to feel the weight of the messages, and thereby generate an emotional response.
