

Celebrating Our English Curriculum Highlights from Autumn 1



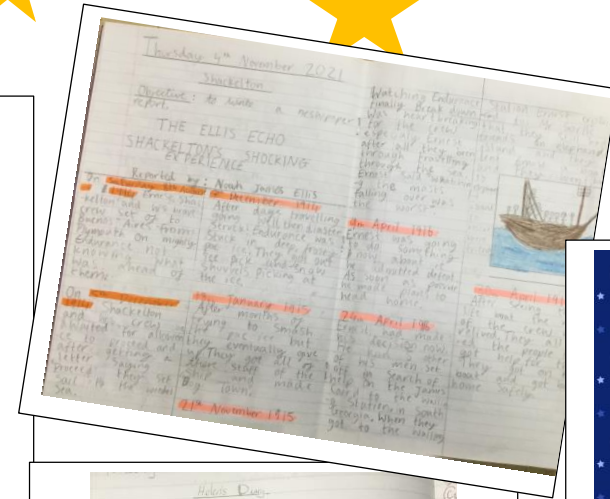
EYFS

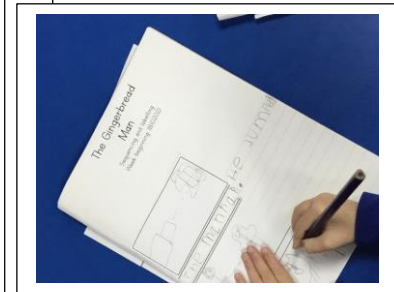
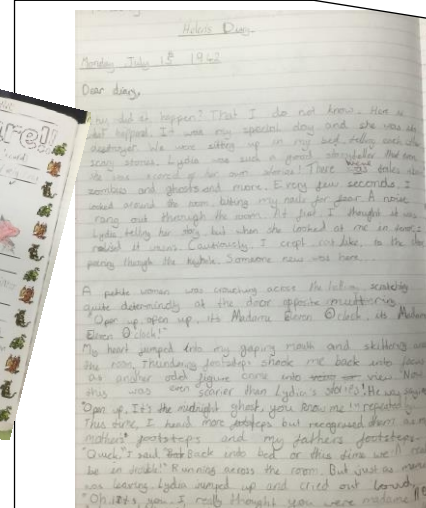
have loved finding out all about dragons with their book 'The Dragon Machine'. They've produced some fabulous posters showcasing what they've learnt over the last few weeks.
