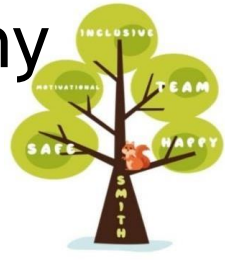
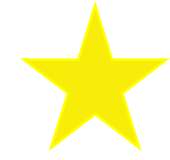

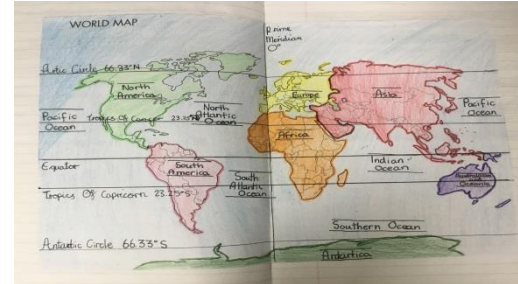


Celebrating our Geography Curriculum - highlights from last half term!

EYFS

Nursery children have been fascinated by landmarks in different places. They are beginning to understand their world and the world around them.

Reception have been investigating their own school surroundings and have compared them to other hotter and colder places.

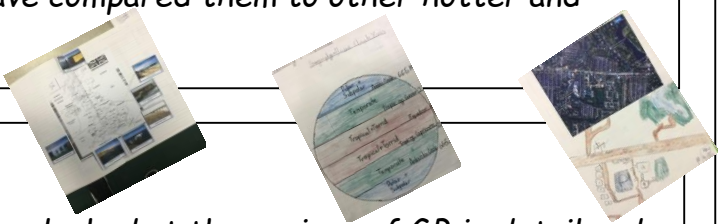


Lower KS2

Year 3 and Year 4 have looked at the regions of GB in detail and have compared them to different places and historical times. They have studied the water cycle, coastal erosion and effects humans are having on the environment using P4C to discuss.

Upper KS2

Year 5 have studied areas of the world and have looked at water and land use in South America (now and in the past). Year 6 have investigated time zones and the economic, cultural and climate differences within them.



KS1

Year 1 have worked very well studying the local area and have made local maps, in and out of school. They have compared natural things to those made by us humans.

Year 2 have taken the study of owls to a higher level. They have located where owls come from in different climate zones and geographical locations.

What's to come next term...

- In EYFS children will continue to investigate the world around them and will begin to compare
- KS1 will be comparing areas in the UK with small areas outside of Europe
- KS2 will be designing road trips, investigating mountains, investigating settlements, comparing rural to urban places and looking at how animals have adapted to different places.
