- To identify initial sounds in words
- To segment the sounds and blend them together in three letter words (CVC).

Physical Development

- As always, we will be providing lots of fine motor activities to support hand strength for holding a pencil e.g. using pincers, threading (anteaters tongue), playdough and explorative mark making.
- We look forward to learning some new dance moves in PE and choreographing some simple movements to make a short motif.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

- This half term we will continue celebrating ourselves and our families. We will explore our similarities and differences.
- As well as this we will be talking about friendship and respect and sharing what they mean to all of us.
- We will continue incorporating **sensory time** into our day to ensure we are ready for learning.
- Creating opportunities for children to build constructive and respectful **relationships** by encouraging them to independently manage disagreements with peers.
- Anti-Bullying Week i.e. Friendship Week expressing their feelings and consider the feelings of others.
- **Personal hygiene** oral care / brushing teeth, including a special visit from the Dental Team!

Maths

- We will continue to develop our understanding of number and the value of each amount up to 5.
- As always, we are working extra hard to from our numbers correctly on our whiteboards and in our books.
- We will be comparing quantities.
- We will be introducing part, part, whole models and recording number sentences.

Number Blocks is a great supporting resource for maths and we recommend you use this at home as well as looking around for numbers and shapes in the environment.



Understanding of the World (UtW)

- This half term we will continue to focus to explore the **wonder of nature** and how it changes with each season. We will compare the difference from **Autumn and Winter**, especially talking about the frost, ice and snow recently.
- We will also be exploring in the **wild garden**, looking for mini beasts and learning new ways to catch and safely trap bugs to study what we find.
- We will be exploring a number of **different faiths** this half term and **celebrations** such as Diwali, Sukkot, Hannukah and Christmas. We will also discuss all other celebrations like birthdays, christenings and weddings etc.
- Following on from last half term's special places topic in RE, we will be **visiting our local church** to explore the story of the Christmas Nativity.
- We will extend our understanding of our **local area** in geography by finding a post box to post our letters to Santa.
- Fire Safety linked to bonfire night.
- Road Safety Our lollipop lady will take us to Neilson Road to practice how to cross the road safely.



Expressive Arts and Design (EAD)



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- This half term, we will celebrate **Interfaith Week** and as part of this we will be building many different religious buildings. We will also be making Diya lamps, from clay, as part of our learning linked to Diwali.
- Using different media and manipulating materials to create pictures fireworks, rockets, rangoli patterns, Christmas decorations.
- Singing different songs: 5 focus nursery rhymes as part of **World Nursery Rhyme**Week. When the Ants go marching in, Traditional Christmas songs.
- Our music lessons will give us the opportunity to listen to and hear traditional music from a variety of countries around the world. We will express ourselves through movement and interpretation and will share our opinions on the music we hear.
